SCHOOL AND COMMUNITY

Founded in 2003, Trinity International School provides a challenging college preparatory, American curriculum to meet the needs of K-12 international students living in Bangkok, Thailand. The total enrollment is 392 students in grades K-12. Of these 126 students are in grades 9-12. There are currently 21 seniors, 52.38% are ethnically Thai or mixed race, and all are bilingual, often speaking English as a second or third language. Most students at Trinity hold citizenship from multiple countries due to diverse families. As of 2022-2023 the nationality profile of our community is as follows; 41.33% Thai, 34.95% Japanese, 8.42% Korean, 2.30% Indian, 2.30% Taiwanese, 2.04% Vietnamese, 1.79% Filipino, 1.28% Myanmar, 1.28% Chinese, 0.77% Russian, 0.77% Italian, 0.77% Indonesian, 0.51% Malaysian, 0.51% Brazilian, 0.26% Nigerian, 0.26% Hongkong, 0.26% Israeli.

ACADEMIC PROGRAM

The academic program is organized on a rotating block schedule. 7.5 credits per semester is the standard course load: students take seven 50-minute block classes with one 20-minute slot per day dedicated to a school activity, social-emotional wellness programs, or improving literacy through the DEAR reading program. Block classes are year-long: each core class meets daily, while elective classes in High School meet anywhere from 3 – 5 times per week. Block scheduling was instituted in 2007. In grades-12, we offer 69 courses 54 are core subjects, and 15 are electives. 29 classes are dedicated to Math, Science, and English, while 7 are Computer and Programing-based courses. Trinity offers 5 AP subjects on campus; these are AP Physics, AP Biology, AP Chemistry, AP Calculus B/C. Each class runs for 50 Minutes per day. Elective 1 subjects meet 3 times a week, while Elective 2 meets daily. The passing grade for a subject that does not result in summer school is 60%. Students are required to enroll in five academic classes per semester in all grades, in addition to values and leadership classes each year. In Grades 9 & 10, students add one elective course, and in Grades 11 & 12, they add an additional “core” academic elective.

Each student must earn a total of 29.5 credits and achieve a GPA of at least 1.75 to graduate from TRIS. The school also offers Honors Diplomas Both Honors Diplomas require a GPA of at least 3.50; the Following is a list and breakdown of all Diplomas offered at TRIS with the Elective classes required.

Honors Diploma 2 or more AP courses with GPA 3.5 or higher. TRIS students are required to complete 15 hours/year of Community Service during their course of High School study.

ADVANCED PLACEMENT TRIS offers five official AP courses. Enrollment in AP courses is determined by academic achievement, fulfilling prerequisites, and by gaining departmental approval. All students taking AP courses are required to take the AP exam in May of each year. The classes offered as part of the curriculum are AP Physics, AP Language, AP Chemistry, AP Biology, and AP Calculus. Students can also take AP Psychology as a self-study course with once-a-week Tutoring offered on Campus.

In May 2022, 57 AP Exams were taken. Those exams were as follows; 7 AP Biology, 14 AP Calculus AB and 2 of BC, 9 AP Chemistry, 1 AP Computer Science, 7 AP English Language and Composition, 1 AP Environmental Science, 10 AP Physics 5 AP Psychology. Of those exams, 60% received a score of 3 or Higher.

For May of 2023 67 Exams have currently been registered for these are in the following areas; AP Computer science, AP English Language and Composition, AP Psychology, AP Biology, AP Calculus AB, AP Physics, AP Chemistry, AP Calculus BC, AP Micro Economics, AP Environmental Science

RANK TRIS **does not rank**, and computes both weighted and unweighted GPAs for work included on the transcript. One point is added to the cumulative weighted GPA for each AP course.
